**Luke 9:1** Then He called His twelve disciples together and gave them power and authority over all demons, and to cure diseases.



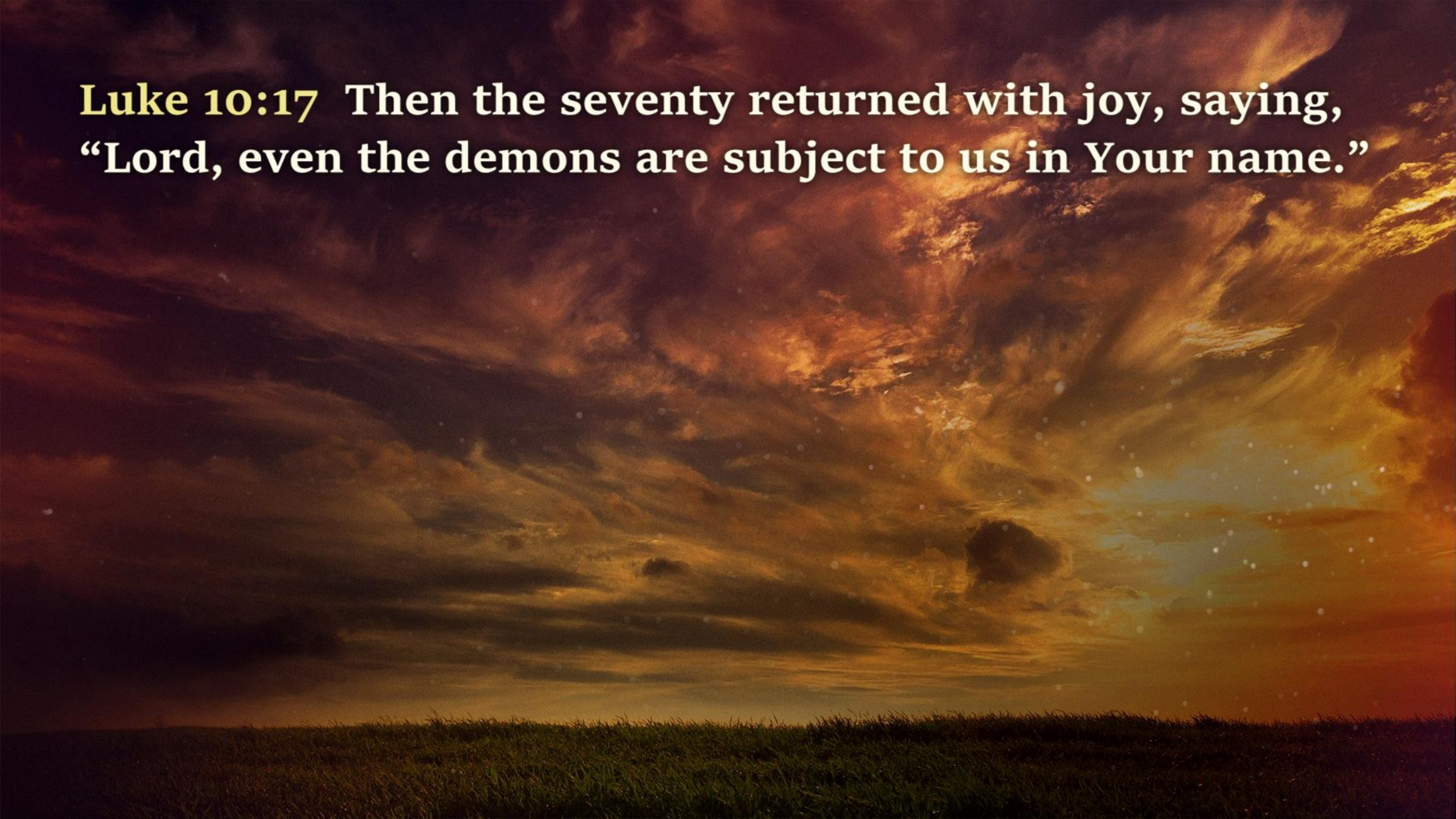
**Luke 10:3** “Go your way; behold, I send you out as lambs among wolves.<sup>4</sup> Carry neither money bag, knapsack, nor sandals; and greet no one along the road.<sup>5</sup> But whatever house you enter, first say, ‘Peace to this house.’<sup>6</sup> And if a son of peace is there, your peace will rest on it; if not, it will return to you.<sup>7</sup> And remain in the same house, eating and drinking such things as they give, for the laborer is worthy of his wages. Do not go from house to house.<sup>8</sup> Whatever city you enter, and they receive you, eat such things as are set before you.”




